 What did FOREST EUROPE do to support you in developing soft skills or organizational skills?

As the Head of the FOREST EUROPE Sub-Commission in IFSA, I am responsible for communication between the two organizations. This allows me to learn a lot from the FOREST EUROPE process and its representatives. I had the chance to participate in the High-Level Policy Dialogue, as well as two Expert Level Meetings, and am currently preparing to join the 9th Ministerial Conference.

Through these experiences, I had an opportunity to see how the political dialogue and negotiations on the international level are happening, and even participated directly, representing IFSA. I would like to highlight that FOREST EUROPE, while providing these opportunities, also offers strong capacity support. With this support, we can communicate our ideas and interests more effectively, developing strong suggestions that can have a positive impact.

Beyond that, I am leading the IFSA Youth Task Force, working on the youth position paper, which will be presented at the FOREST EUROPE 9th Ministerial Conference in October 2024, in Bonn, Germany. As part of the process, we organized two youth consultation workshops, where we collected youth views on the future of European forest policies. This has given us a practical experience of negotiation facilitation among youth. And the following writing process will further broaden our knowledge of policy development.

As a second-year Master's student, the question of the job search is extremely relevant to me. The communication skills acquired through the IFSA position and network developed within FOREST EUROPE are particularly helpful. Participation in the processes provides an overview of the political trends and potential fields of demand for forestry specialists. The skills and knowledge gained in policy development and negotiations open new opportunities and give insights into what actual work can be like.

I would also like to emphasize the FOREST EUROPE webinar series, which among many topics, provides an overview of Green Forest Jobs. The different and sometimes unexpected career paths presented at the webinar show how interesting and inspiring the work in the forest sector can be.

• Which skills help you now to ease your job search (or writing Master Theses or...)

• What does FOREST EUROPE do to include the youth actively?

FOREST EUROPE is actively involving youth in meaningful ways. One key initiative is their inclusion of young people in ELM (Expert Level Meeting) participation. Additionally, FOREST EUROPE collaborates with IFSA to gather youth perspectives on the importance of their involvement in forest policy across Europe.

To achieve this, FOREST EUROPE has assembled a team of six young individuals from various European countries who have conducted workshops to gather insights from young foresters. These workshops focus on youth perspectives on FOREST EUROPE's work, particularly in sustainable forest management and Green Forest Jobs. The findings from these workshops will be presented at the Ministerial Conference in Bonn.

This initiative offers significant benefits. It motivates young people by providing professional development opportunities and exposure to high-level discussions. It also allows FOREST EUROPE and its member countries to gain valuable input from the youth, helping shape the future of Europe's forests based on the visions and ideas of the next generation.

Participating in ELM (Expert Level Meeting) through FOREST EUROPE has been an incredible opportunity for personal and professional growth. Engaging directly with ministerial representatives from various European countries and witnessing negotiations on crucial documents has been an enriching experience. • Which skills help you now to ease your job search (or writing Master Theses or...)

Thanks to FOREST EUROPE actively including youth in its work and the last Expert Level Meeting, I have more grounds to claim my expertise and have something to show for it. It feels especially important going forward and transitioning from university studies to work life.
